BLOOMINGTON KENNEDY Eagles 61, HOPKINS Royals 55

Bloomington Kennedy won their second straight Sweet 16 title with persistent efforts on second shots. Also Kennedy's big three: Jade Martin (19), Aubrey Davis (14), and Bailey Lund (13) came through for 75% of the Eagle points. For the game Kennedy had 15 second chance points. Kennedy scored the first four points of the game prompting a quick time out from Hopkins. The Royals got right back into the thick of the action tying the game up at 4 and 6. That is where the Royal offense stopped for the quarter. They didn't score the last four minutes of the first quarter (9 straight possessions) while Kennedy finished up with a 7-0 run.

Kennedy's offensive efficiency ramped up in the second quarter as they added 21 points to their totals. Their pp100 for the 2nd quarter was 123.5. Hopkins was no slouch either on the offensive end adding 19---a 111.8 pp100. Here is the difference however. Hopkins tied the game at 23, but faded again down the last three minutes of the half with six straight empty trips. They did score on their last possession on a Tori Joranson basket, but in between Kennedy ran off 11 unanswered points. Kennedy led at the break 34-25.

Kennedy kept their hot hands in the third quarter with 18 more points to their totals---a 120.0 pp100 (or 128.6 if you discount the last second 3 attempt.). Hopkins on the other hand cooled off somewhat with a 73.3 pp100. Once again Hopkins faded down the stretch in the later part of the quarter After cutting the margin to 41-33 Kennedy out scored the Royals 11-3 the last five minutes of the quarter. So for the last few minutes of each quarter up to this point Kennedy had a 29-5 advantage.

The Royals weren't done competing despite facing a 16 point fourth quarter deficit (52-36). It was Kennedy's turn to go cold. Jade Martin, who had 7 points in the third quarter and 16 heading into the 4th, started the quarter on the bench. The Eagles started the fourth quarter with three straight turnovers. That opened the door for Hopkins slow climb back into the game.

With four minutes to go the margin was 9. With two minutes to go it was 55-50. A seven possession drought didn't help Kennedy cause that much. A Julia Wiemer basket cut the margin to 55-53 with 49.7 seconds left. Aubrey Davis was fouled and delivered both free throws to bump the margin back to four. Nia Coffey was fouled on a second chancer for Hopkins and she delivered on both her free throws for a 57-55 differential. Davis once more stepped up and delivered at the line to make it 59-55. A Hopkins turnover on a Davis steal ended their comeback efforts. On the inbound play Martin was fouled for the final points. To give you an indication of the Hopkins defensive effort in the final quarter---the Martin basket was the only field goal of the quarter for the Eagles. The other seven points came at the line.

I reported on this game in the Sunday Sweet 16 summary. Notes: The quick first quarter lead for Kennedy held up the rest of the game.....Kennedy led by 16 heading into the final quarter....Hopkins came within two, but BK responded with free throws on each occasion.....Jade Martin had 14 points in the middle two quarters.....Hopkins had a +7 advantage in turnovers differential.....BK had 15 second chance points in the first three quarters.....
